

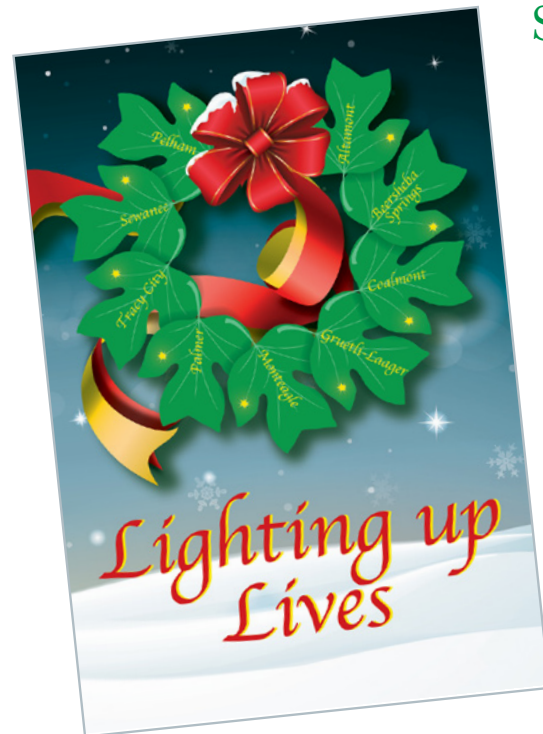

Learning Together

LEARNING for South Cumberland Community Fund means many things, including learning about leadership, learning about philanthropy, learning about opportunities to form new partnerships, and learning about innovative ways of thinking about SCCF's work on the Plateau. SCCF has been able to convene a variety of groups this fall to grow its collective knowledge and collaborative work. From local nonprofits to University of the South students, faculty, and staff, more than 50 people

have participated in one or more SCCF offerings.

In September, Marguerite Kondracke returned to the Mountain and helped SCCF board members and staff and members of the University's Office of Civic Engagement think about their joint efforts. Deb Palmer George of Nashville's Center for Nonprofit Management led a workshop on the Art of Leadership, empowering local leaders to adopt new ways of viewing their organizations and their roles in them. Dr. Arvind Singhal inspired University and

community organizations to explore opportunities for positive deviance by leading participants to those places where people are succeeding beyond all expectations. Students in the Philanthropy Internship Program awarded grants in November after studying philanthropy in the spring term. Under the leadership of Community Development Director Nicky Hamilton, SCCF works to strengthen the local nonprofit sector and increase collaboration by creating ongoing opportunities for learning and sharing.

Philanthropy Internship Program Students Award \$31,566 in Grants

Grants were awarded to eight Plateau nonprofits this fall by University of the South students enrolled in the Philanthropy Internship Program, a unique collaboration between SCCF and the University's Office of Civic Engagement.
